About Colombia Lengupá

The province of Lengupá includes a colourful variety of municipalities throughout the Department of Boyacá. It is characterised by its impressive landscape that is full of diversity; diversity in shape, colour and flora. This beautiful valley in the middle of the central and eastern Andes Mountain Range has two natural frontiers that divide the Colombian geography and make this place a coffee region with uniquely wonderful flavours that we love to enjoy all around the world.

Colombia is the second largest producer of arabica coffee in the world and benefits from its tropical location, mountainous terrain and high average rainfall. Coffee production is abundant, with two harvests per year of excellent quality cherries. Coffee farms that supply this community lot range in altitude from 1200 up to 1800 metres above sea level, temperatures are a mild 19 to 24° Celsius and rainfall is healthy and high. Colombia has a mitaca harvest from April to June and a main harvest from September to December.

Varietal: Caturra / Colombia

Process: Washed

Tasting notes: oolong tea, brown sugar, caramel, milk chocolate, strawberry, red apple

green apple, stewed orange, yellow peach, juicy, sweet, clean, full body, bright

Processing Details

- o Cherries are picked when ripe and red
- o Producers deliver cherries to the mill
- Cherries are pulped and then wet fermented in pillas to remove the mucilage from the beans
- o Beans are then washed thoroughly in washing channels for clarity and vibrancy
- o Beans are dried on beds until moisture content reaches 10-12%
- Beans are combined by the community to create this harvest's Lengupá profile and stored in parchment until ready for milling and export
